GEORGE PILKINGTON (JUNIOR SUITE)

JAMES TAYLOR (SUITE)


There would be no Ceylon Tea without James Taylor. Credited with introducing tea plantations to British Ceylon, Taylor was instrumental in beginning, and thereafter ensuring the success of what continues to be the Nation's foremost export commodity. 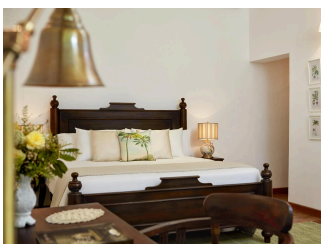
